Plenary Speech at the ILO 110th ILC | 8th June 2022



Norhazlina Mydin, CIH, CPIH, CSFC President, IOHA

Dear President, distinguished delegates, guest, observers, ladies and gentlemen.

Firstly, thank you for giving the International Occupational Hygiene Association (IOHA) the opportunity to speak at this Plenary of the 110th ILC. IOHA, representing 18000 members and 8200 professional occupational hygienists from 35 countries is truly excited to be part of the journey for the amendment of the 1998 Declaration: Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work .Recognition of Health & Safety as a fundamental human right is only the beginning of an exciting journey ahead of us. IOHA believes this will drive 3 Focused Areas, namely:

- 1) Strengthened Regulatory Framework
- 2) Enhanced Capability Building
- 3) Nurture Greater Partnership

Strengthened Regulatory Framework

Director General Guy Rhyder in his speech https://www.ilo.org/global/about-the-ilo/newsroom/news/WCMS_846791/langen/index.htm mentioned that three million lives lost each year because of work-related accidents and diseases, and he stressed the 'stark and clear' responsibility of the ILO to protect workers against sickness, disease and injury arising from employment. Therefore, this demonstrates the urgent need to review and strengthen the legal instrument to provide minimum requirement to protect workers in their working environment. At the time, where businesses are recovering from the impact of COVID-19, economic viability will be a bigger priority for some, over the investments that protect workers' safety, health and well-being. Stronger regulations and enforcement as a result of the adaptation of health and safety as one on the fundamental right will drive the compliance culture.

Enhanced Capability Building

IOHA recognise the concerted effort to enhance capability building especially in the areas of occupational hygiene for various stakeholders. It is not only for the regulatory bodies, but also for professional safety and health organizations, researchers, social security institutions, workers, students who are desperately needed to support the larger companies and SME for implementation of the measures to assure safe and healthy working conditions. Access to trainings is now easier than before with e-learning modules and some are even offered at pro-bono. Aligned with technological enhancement, research to further improve workers' health and safety should also focus in developing economies where a lot more industrialisation is taking place. The aspect of local culture should be taken into considerations to ensure effective strategy and holistic mindset for prevention, which is built on the common desire to promote and establish a global prevention culture.

Greater Partnership

In IOHA, our Mission is to enhance the international network of occupational hygiene organizations that promote, develop, and improve occupational hygiene worldwide, providing a safe and healthy working environment for all. With the recognition of Health & Safety as a fundamental human right, we are even clearer on our contribution to the United Nation Sustainable Development Goals, in particular SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 3 (Good Health and Wellbeing), SDG 4 (Quality Education) and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals). The Tokyo Declaration on Vision Zero for All 2022 is another testament for greater partnership across the globe. Plenary Speech at the ILO 110th ILC 8th June 2022

In conclusion, access to safe and healthy working environment is not option, it is the fundamental right of the 3.3 billion workforces globally. It is the right thing to do.

IOHA contributes to Vision Zero Japan Conference and Co-Sign the Tokyo Declaration on Vision Zero for all

The International Occupational Hygiene Association (IOHA) is honored and pleased to have contributed significantly to the huge success of the Vision Zero Summit held virtually in Tokyo, Japan from May 11th to May 13th, 2022. The Tokyo, Japan conference was the second Summit after the inaugural one held in Helsinki, Finland in November 2019. The Vision Zero Concept (zero occupational accident, illnesses and fatalities) was first proposed at the 2014 World Congress on Safety and Health at Work.

The Vision Zero at Enterprise Level Task Group created by the Global Coalition for Safety and Health at Work was responsible to support and collaborate with the Japan organizing committee (JOC) and assist the ORP Foundation in overall conference preparation.

For IOHA, all these actions are aligned with our Mission and our call for increased collaboration. Vision Zero is also align with UN's Sustainable Development Goals such as 8 "Decent Work and Economic Growth", also the other SDGs include several goals and subgoals that are supported by the Vision Zero approach. These include, amongst others, "Good Health and Wellbeing" (SDG 3), Quality Education" (SDG 4), and "Partnership for the Goals" (SDG 17)

As it was presented on different tribunes, the protection of workers is a multi-stakeholder challenge. All actions at all levels can have a positive impact, and the leadership of Governments, Organizations and Enterprise through their Corporate Social Responsibility and its impact on their worldwide supply chain is a tremendous gain.

IOHA, through its 20,000 members in 35 countries will continue to collaborate with all partners to play an active role to protect workers health and safety. Our expertise is in the field where hazards must be identified, controlled and prevented before they become accident, illnesses or fatalities. Together, there's so much we can do.

Rene Leblanc (Canada-CRBOH), past IOHA President (2020) represented IOHA for the last three years at the VZ at Enterprise Level Committee. 

2022 William Steiger Memorial Awardee



IOHA is proud that our Past President, Andrea Hiddinga-Schipper is the 2022 William Steiger Award recipient.

The William Steiger Memorial Award honors individuals from the social/political sphere whose efforts have contributed to advancements in occupational safety and health.

Andrea studied Environmental Sciences at the Prof. H.C. van Hall institute in Groningen (1987-1991), then went to the Agricultural University of Wageningen where she studied Environment, Labor and Health at the Faculty of Environmental Health (1991-1994).

In 1994 she began her professional career as a researcher at TNO in Rijswijk. In her work for TNO she focused on exposure modelling for pesticides and biocides. She participated in several exposure studies for industry and government at national and European level. Andrea then worked for 20 years for Arbo Unie, an occupational health and safety service, as a consultant in different sectors, e.g. government, health care and industry, leading several expert groups within the company. Since August 2021, she started her own company AHOH-projects.

In her volunteer life, she has been involved in national and international activities. Andrea has been a member of the NVvA since 1994, a registered member since 1998 and a board member since 2020. In this role, she represents the NVvA in the European Platform for Occupational Hygiene (EPOH) and in OHTA as part of the Awards & Qualifications Committee.

Andrea served for 10 years on the board of the International Occupational Hygiene Association (IOHA); as board member, secretary-treasurer (2011-2015) and president (2017-2018). As an executive on the IOHA board, she developed the 2016-2020 strategy. Andrea is currently a member of the Stakeholders Relations Committee and is the liaison for liaison with the International Labor Organization (ILO) and in recent years led the lobbying for the IOHA on the recognition of safety and health as a fundamental rights.

Her vision links working conditions to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as defined by the United Nations (UN). In doing so, she recognizes that labour is inextricably linked to People, Planet, Prosperity, Peace and Partnership, and that achieving these goals is impossible without partnership and collaboration with other disciplines. In her presidency, Andrea has focused specifically on reaching out to other professions.

Her drive is to achieve real understanding and a working solution through collaborative analysis, from people with different knowledge and backgrounds. Her curiosity, knowledge and expertise and her drive to collaborate with other disciplines forms the basis to make this possible
